- 10. *Timeline*: Record the important events in Columbus's life.



- 9. Timeline: Create a timeline of Columbus's life and key events during that time period.







Facts about Christopher Columbus

Fold in sides so image is on front.




Side card fold

He had three ships and left from Spain; He sailed through sunshine, wind and rain. "Indians! Indians!" Columbus cried; His heart was filled with joyful pride.


He sailed by night; he sailed by day; He used the stars to find his way. But "India" the land was not; It was the Bahamas, and it was hot.


